





Numaligarh rampart: A Historical Tour
(A Field Study and Awareness Programme)

A combined field trip to the historical Numaligarh rampart was organized for the students of History (Honours) and the students enrolled with the add on course of Tourism in North-East India of J.D.S.G. College, the students of History (Honours) of Marangi Mahavidyalaya and Numaligarh Higher Secondary School on 10th April, 2023. The field survey was conducted by the three institutions in collaboration with Bokakhat Journalist Association. The primary motive behind the field trip was to raise awareness about the rampart among the students and to suggest measures for its preservation. The program began with the school song performed by the students of Numaligarh Higher Secondary School. The inaugural lecture was delivered by Principal, Numaligarh Higher Secondary School where he gave a brief description on the historical identity of the Numaligarh rampart and the works so far done by the Directorate of Archaeology, Assam for its preservation. He explained the further necessity for its preservation as the rampart is on the verge of extinction due to governmental negligence and lack of awareness among the general public. A lecture on the rampart and its history was delivered by Dr. Bijoy Sarmah, Associate Professor, Department of History, J.D.S.G. College. He also discussed about the importance of preserving the rampart for our future generation to understand our glorious past. The next lecture was given by Chiranjib Dahal and Amarjit Hazarika, Assistant Professors from the Department of History, J.D.S.G. College where both gave an historical introduction of the rampart and suggested measures for its preservation. The final lecture was given by a member of Bokakhat Journalist Association who explained the role so far played by the association towards the preservation of the rampart. He further assured the Bokakhat Journalist Association will do the needful in the near future to maintain the existence of the rampart. At last the students are asked to give their feedback on the program and the things they learned from the session to which Kuhismita Borah, a student of 6th semester History (Honours) of J.D.S.G. College gave her feedback about what she learned about the rampart from the program. After the lecture program was over the students went to physically survey the rampart along with their respective mentors from the three institutions.




