
Above- Students participating in Filed Study on People's Participation in Lok Sabha Elections, 2024

INTRODUCTION:

An in-depth survey was carried out by the students of 6th Semester (Honours) CBCS of the Education Department for the fulfillment of their course work in relation with their paper DSEED 604 (PROJECT REPORT) in the village of Khotiakholi, located in the Bokakhat region in Golaghat district, Assam. on 23.3.2024. The students were supervised by the faculty members of the Education department J.D.S.G college, Bokakhat

The survey was conducted under the supervision of the faculty members Mrs. Ruli Khanikar, Mrs. Pranati Talukdar, Mr. Chandrakanta Das, Mrs. Monjumoni Neog. The purpose of the survey was to understand and analyze the socio-economic issues faced by the residents of the area. The total students of 6th semester were 24 and they were divided into 4 groups .This report presents the findings, insights based on the survey data collected through interviews, focus group discussions, and observations.

OBJECTIVE OF THE SURVEY:

The survey aimed to identify socio-economic challenges faced by villagers, their impact on education, health, and livelihood, and provide recommendations for addressing these issues, using 40 households and structured questionnaires, semi-structured interviews, and participatory observation techniques.

FINDINGS:

Economic challenges like dependency on agriculture, unemployment, and a lack of financial institutions are among the economic issues that cause people to turn to unofficial moneylenders and migrate to neighboring towns. The village faces educational issues, including inadequate school infrastructure, high dropout rates, limited parental awareness, and limited healthcare access. Additionally, poor access to clean drinking water leads to waterborne diseases like diarrhea and cholera. Malnutrition, gender inequality, substance abuse, and cultural conflicts are prevalent issues affecting children and women, particularly pregnant mothers, affecting economic and social behavior, and posing challenges for modern education and health.

CONCLUSION:

The survey highlighted that while Khotiakholi has immense potential for growth, the village faces several socio-economic challenges that hinder its progress. By addressing these issues collectively through government, NGOs, and community participation, significant improvements can be achieved. The students of the 6th Semester Education Department gained valuable insights and experiences through this field study, which can contribute to their understanding of real-world challenges.

Majuli is considered the epicentre of Vaisnavism, a monotheistic branch of Hinduism. In the 15th century Sankardeva along with his disciple Madhavdeva, established several satras on the island. These satras play a crucial role in preserving the traditional music, dance and literature of Assam.

On 2nd May 2024, a total number of 30 students from the fourth semester, History Department JDSG College, were taken on an educational tour to the satra city of Majuli to experience its vibrant culture and spiritual significance. The students have visited Auniati Satra, Garmur Satra and Chamaguri Satra in Majuli along with the teachers. They saw and experienced their unique traditional mask making practise, an art form used in religious plays and performances. The Chamaguri Satra is famous for producing vibrant, handcrafted masks used in Bhaona performances. The atmosphere of Majuli fascinated everyone.

The island is also known for its handloom and handicraft industry. Students also saw there the rearing of mulberry silk, boat-making practise, various wood works etc.
